III. Public Comment

Sue Jacobse provided a handout containing information about The Money Game Theme Park scheduled for Saturday, June 21, 2008, at the FGCU Student Union; expressed positive comments regarding the future of the District.

Bob Rushlow, President of the Support Personnel Association of Lee County, expressed concerns regarding Item VI.B., Reduction in Force; commended the Board and the Florida School Boards Association for pursuing the Adequacy Lawsuit; and stated the need to educate the community regarding the negative effect on education that could result with the passage of the amendments that will appear on the November ballot.

Mrs. Dozier responded to speakers as follows: thanked Ms. Jacobse for her positivism and stated that the District would continue to explore ways to enhance its programs; acknowledged that a reduction in force is always the most difficult things to do and added that the Governor's need to identify another 4% budget reduction would not affect education.

B. Reduction in Force.

Motion by Mr. Teuber and seconded by Dr. Kuckel to accept the Superintendent's recommendation that the Board approve a layoff for the job classifications: Clerk-Typist; Secretary, School; Site Worker; Specialist, Inventory; Specialist, Stock Control; Specialist, Support; Stock Room Clerk and Bus Attendant. Employees will be laid off in inverse order of their seniority in the District as required to align with the decrease in State Funding.

Mr. Chilmonik stated that he could not support the Superintendent's recommendation because he believes that the District needs to look at some reductions in operations and still needs to consider transferring a portion of capital dollars to operating.

Motion carried 4-1, with Mr. Chilmonik casting the vote in opposition to the Motion.

C. Property and Casualty Insurance Renewal.

Motion by Dr. Kuckel, seconded by Dr. Scricca, and carried 5-0 to accept the Superintendent's recommendation that the Board approve the property and casualty insurance renewal through Employer's Mutual, Inc. for the period July 1, 2008, through June 30, 2009, at a cost not to exceed \$7,510,000.

Mrs. Dozier recessed the Board Meeting and opened the Public Hearing at 6:53 P.M. She asked if anyone would like to address the Board regarding the four issues on the agenda for Public Hearing.

Bob Rushlow, President of the Support Personnel Association of Lee County, addressed Item VII.A., Revisions to Policy 7.04, Driving and Replacing District Vehicles. He questioned whether or not, in light of the budget situation, the District should pursue installing GPS systems on District vehicles.

Dr. Browder stated that installation of GPS systems has not been expanded to the "white fleet."

Mrs. Dozier suggested future discussion surrounding this issue. Dr. Browder stated that he would bring this back to the Board at a point when the District could afford it.

There being no further requests to address the Board, Mrs. Dozier closed the Public Hearing and reconvened the Board Meeting at 6:56 P.M.

A. Revisions to Policy 7.04, Driving and Replacing District Vehicles.

Motion by Mr. Teuber, seconded by Dr. Scricca, and carried 5-0 to accept the Superintendent's recommendation that the Board approve the revisions to Policy 7.04, Driving and Replacing District Vehicles, to revise the suggested schedule for replacing vehicles.

B. Contract Renewals of The Lee Charter Foundation Charter Schools, Bonita Springs Charter School, Cape Coral Charter School, Gateway Charter High School; Gateway Elementary Charter School, Gateway Intermediate Charter School and Six Mile Charter Academy School.

Motion by Dr. Kuckel, seconded by Mr. Chilmonik, and carried 5-0 to accept the Superintendent's recommendation that the Board approve the contract renewals of The Lee Charter Foundation charter schools, Bonita Springs Charter School, Cape Coral Charter School, Gateway Charter High School, Gateway Elementary Charter School, Gateway Intermediate Charter School, and Six Mile Charter Academy School.

Mr. Chilmonik: stated that he would not be participating in the June 24th Special Board Meeting via telephone; stated that while he understood the reason for a reduction in force, he felt that the District could do more in the area of operational effectiveness.

Dr. Kuckel: none.

Dr. Scricca: encouraged Mr. Chilmonik to bring to the Superintendent any suggestions he might have with regard to what more the District could do in its current situation; commended the Associations for their actions and continued efforts to better serve the District's students.

Mr. Teuber: expressed his support of the reduction in force and commended the Bargaining Units and the Superintendent for doing as much as possible before turning to cuts in personnel; stated that he attended last week's Florida School Boards Association (FSBA) conference and distributed to Dr. Kuckel, Dr. Scricca and Mr. Chilmonik a framed photo of the Board Room from Harvard Jolly.

Mrs. Dozier: congratulated staff on a smooth close of the 2007-2008 school year; reminded the public to watch out for students on summer break; applauded the District's two students who performed the National Anthem at last week's FSBA conference; thanked her fellow Board Members for their patience and flexibility during the past year while she served as the President of FSBA.

B. Attorney's Comments/Reports – None.

C. Superintendent's Comments/Reports

Dr. Browder: announced that while regular school is out, the District began summer school today; thanked Dr. Dinon for the recognition he received this evening; acknowledged that Mrs. Dozier had represented the community and the District in an outstanding manner and thanked her for her leadership at FSBA and for all of the positive accolades she brought to the School District over the past year.
