Safety Training Program

The School Board shall provide safe and healthful working conditions. The School Board shall also establish operating practices that will result in safe working conditions and efficient operations.

- (1) Each building administrator shall be responsible for the supervision of a comprehensive safety program for students and staff.
- (2) All District employees shall be trained using nationally approved training materials as required by federal, State and local regulations. Training shall be offered at times convenient to employees in areas including but not limited to Fire Safety, Asbestos, HazMat (Right-to-Know), Blood Borne Pathogens, Air Borne Pathogens, TB, and PPE (Personal Protective Equipment).
- (3) Each building administrator shall be responsible to ensure all employees have completed annual safety training.
- (4) The Department of Safety, Security and Inspections shall be responsible for monitoring, auditing and compliance of appropriate and complete safety training provided in the District.
- (5) Each District facility shall have in place a safety committee to review and monitor all safety related incidents and environments including, but not limited to, in-service training on safety related topics, accident prevention, accident record keeping, plant inspection, fire prevention, school site modification, and emergency procedures and traffic safety problems relevant to students, employees, and the community.
- (6) The Superintendent shall establish a District Safety Committee to review annually District safety issues and unresolved site safety issues as specified in collective bargaining agreements.
