Parents may exercise their parental rights within the Parent Bill of Rights and submit an individual request to their child's school for an alert to be placed on the child's Destiny account, identifying the book as prohibited for media checkout.

Thirteen Reasons Why, by Jay Asher is a book you may be familiar with because of the controversial Netflix series of the same name. It is a novel about a suicide. The novel follows a high school girl who kills herself after creating a series of tapes for her classmates to play after her death. She gave the tapes to people who influenced her decision.

A Colorado community ordered librarians to temporarily stop circulating the book as seven students killed themselves. There was no evidence that any of the students who killed themselves were inspired by the series or the book.

Some would argue that suicide is a very real treat to our young people and therefore books like this are needed; others would say books like this can lead to suicide. I will leave you to make your own mind up about that. Many psychiatrists, and mental health professionals claim that this book could prompt troubled young people to copy the suicide of its central character, Hannah Baker.

"We have a responsibility to protect children and teenagers," said Dr. Helen Rayner, a psychiatrist specializing in children and adolescent mental health. "Dramatic and detailed portrayals of suicide needlessly put vulnerable young people at risk of copycat behavior as they see how to carry out harmful or potentially fatal acts." Some critics say the book romanticizes suicide.

This may be a better book for teachers and parents to read then middle school aged children or even high schoolers. It is scientifically proven that the teenage brain has not yet developed the maturity to see the long-term results of decisions. That is why teens are typically more impulsive, willing to take risks that you and I would not, and often make poor decisions. Maybe this book would be better introduced when a person has matured to the point that they understand suicide is a permanent solution to a temporary problem. According to the Lee County Schools website, suicide is the third leading cause of death in youth ages 10 – 24 (just posted Nov. 1, 2021) and that "lesbian, gay, transgender, bi-sexual, and questioning (LGBTQ) individuals are almost three times more likely than others to experience a mental health condition such as major depression or generalized anxiety disorder... LGBTQ youth are two to three times more likely to attempt suicide than straight youth."

There are a total of 98 copies of this book in Lee County Schools. More troubling than that is South Fort Myers High school has 16 copies, and 18 copies can be found in Bonita Springs High School. The only reason that I can think that you would need that many copies in a single library is if it is assigned reading by a teacher. Suicide is complex and highly personal. I do not know anyone that is trained and skilled enough to tackle this problem in a classroom setting. This is one problem that should be left to the parents and professionals, not the schools.

Thirteen Reasons Why, can be found in the following middle schools in Lee County: Cypress Lake (3 copies), Lehigh (5 copies), Caloosa, Lexington, Oak Hammock (5 copies), Paul L. Dunbar, Gulf Middle, Bonita Springs, Three Oaks, Veterans Park Academy of the Arts, and Success Academy. I do not think 10-14 year old children are developed enough for this book. This book can be found in the following High Schools: Cypress Lake, Dunbar, Fort Myers, Mariner, South Fort Myers, Cape Coral, Estero, Ida S. Baker, North Fort Myers, Riverdale, Gateway, and Bonita Springs high schools.
