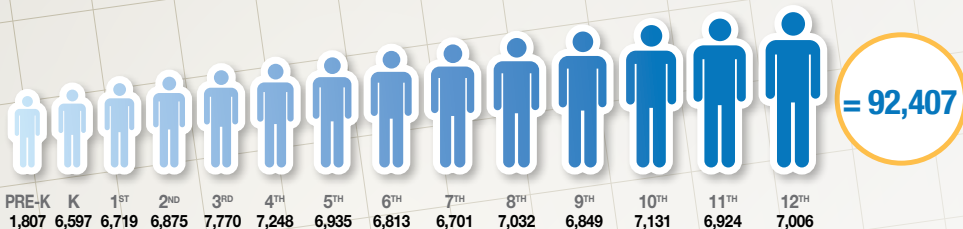

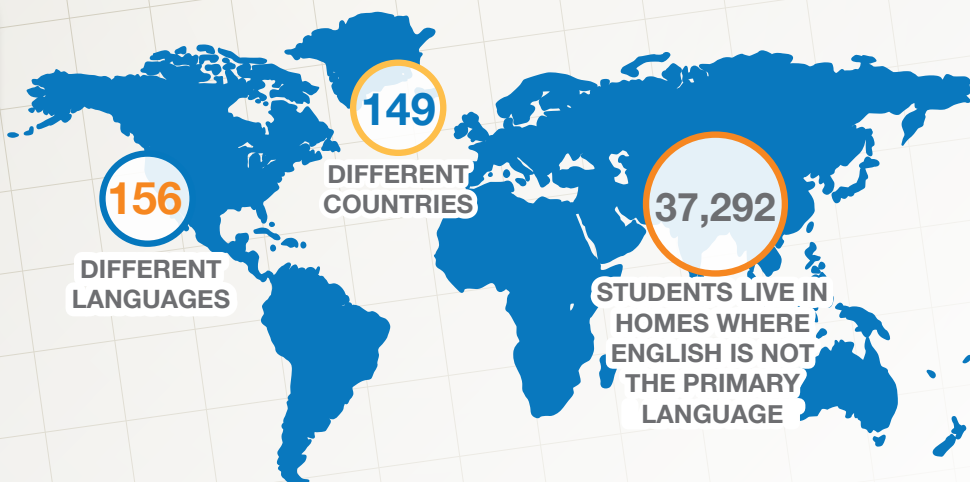

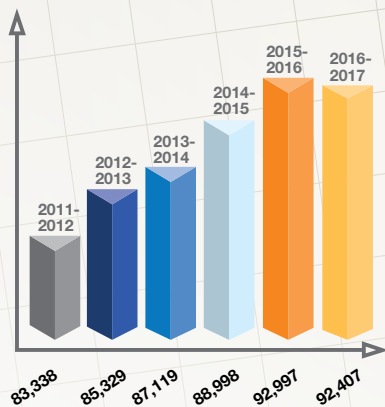

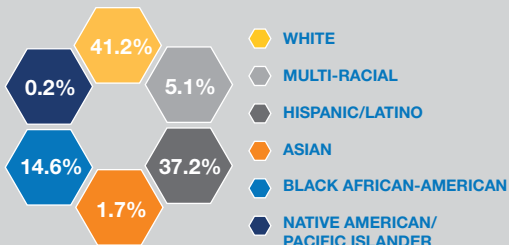

STUDENT RACIAL DIVERSITY*

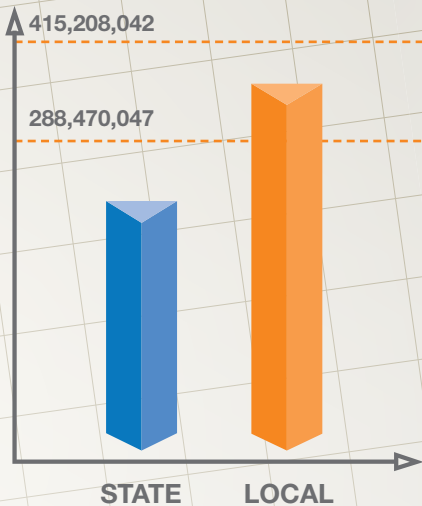

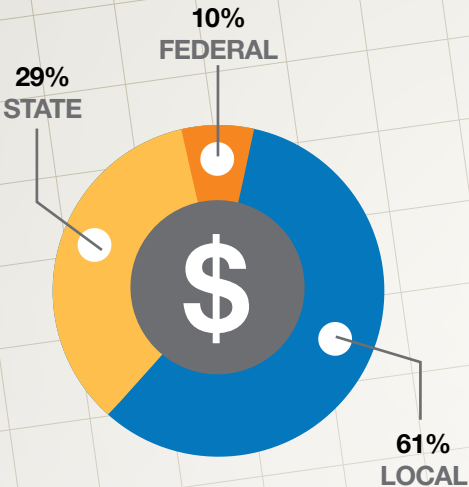

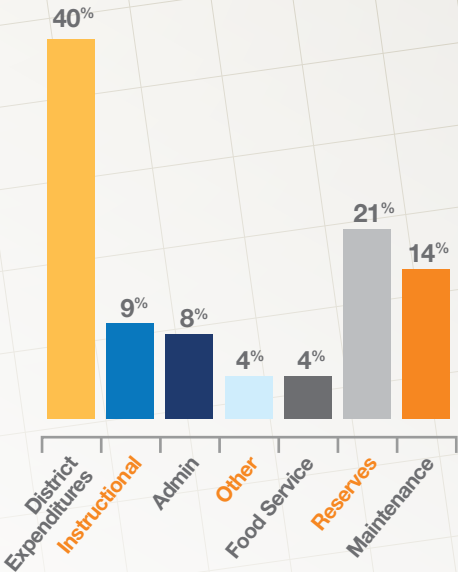
GENERAL FUND: STATE VS LOCAL



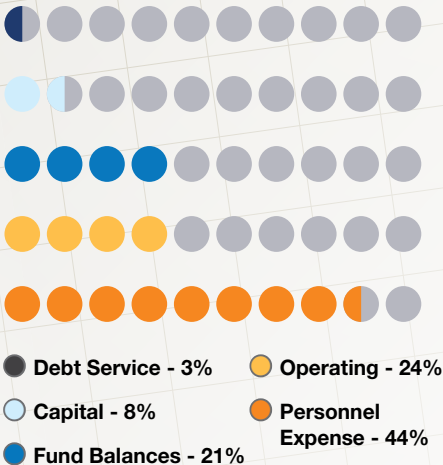
ALL FUNDS: REV SOURCES

*The increase in Capital for the 2016-2017 budget is due to the Certificates of Participation being issued for the LLL High School build in the South Zone.

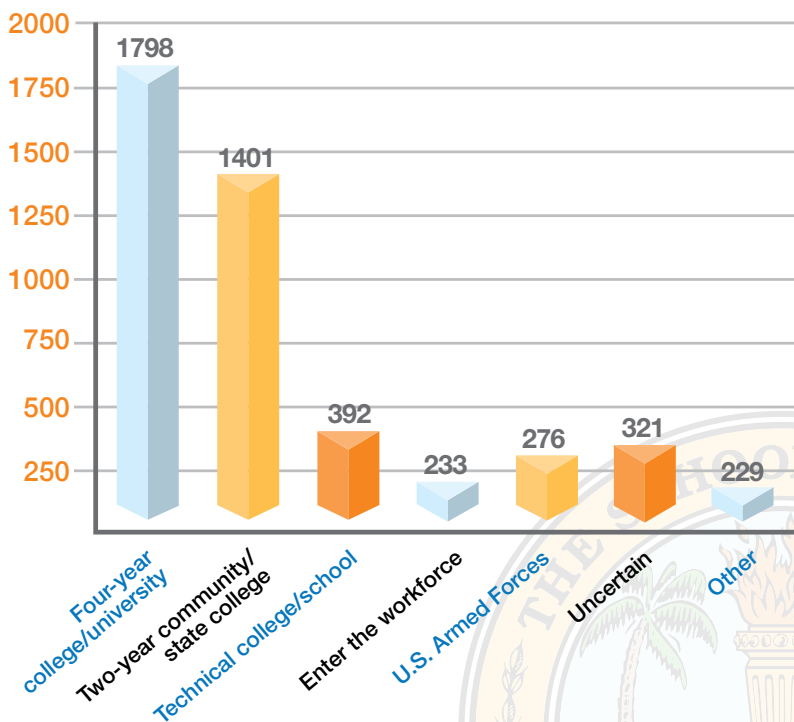
CLASS OF 2016 EARNS MILLIONS IN SCHOLARSHIPS

The Lee County School District graduating class of 2016 has earned millions of dollars in scholarships and will be attending colleges, universities and technical centers across the United States.



2016 GRADUATING CLASS

The latest figures (from December 2016) place our graduation rate at 77.8%. This figure increases to 88.2% when looking only at our 13 “traditional” high schools and excluding Charter Schools or Special Centers. Along with scholarship dollars earned, members of the Class of 2016 reported their post high school plans.



CAREER & TECH EDUCATION

Lee County's middle and high schools offer a diverse collection of Career & Technical Education (CTE) programs to prepare students for college and career readiness.

Over 4,600 Industry Certifications were earned by middle and high school students during the 2016-2017 school year.

OVER 60% of Lee County's high school students are enrolled in at least **ONE Career & Technical Education** course.

- The Career & Technical Education department partners with The Foundation for Lee County Public Schools to coordinate the **STEM@Work program** as well as the annual STEMtastic event. Over **2,000 high school students** applied to participate in the 2016-2017 STEM@Work program which provides students with opportunities to visit and interact with STEM businesses throughout Southwest Florida.
- The School District of Lee County is one of over 30 nationwide **Ford Next Generation Learning (Ford NGL) Communities**.
- **Digital Lee** provides an opportunity for students to compete in digital design. Local businesses and community members judge entries and provide sponsorships to sustain the program. During the 2016-2017 school year, all 13 high schools, 3 middle schools, and 2 technical colleges participated in the showcase, representing approximately 300 students.

ADVANCED STUDIES

District offerings include the prestigious **International Baccalaureate (IB)**, **Cambridge AICE**, **Advanced Placement (AP)**, **Honors** programs and **Dual Enrollment** at the high school level in each attendance zone.

We have approximately **6,279** **Gifted Students** and **12,234** **ESE Students** enrolled (as of 5/28/17)

Awards also given to students include tablets, computers and gift cards for **STEM** and **DIGITAL DESIGN**

In addition to these impactful numbers we also:

- Taught **890 5th graders** how to ballroom dance and how to treat others with dignity and respect through our Dancing Classrooms program
- Gave **5,976 5th grade students** the opportunity to create vanity license plates through Kids Tag Art
- Made free supplies available to teachers and students through our **Education Resource Center**, which is open two days per week and visited by 100 teachers per month
- Supplied over **500 homeless students** with necessities ranging from toiletries to pencils and paper
- Worked with students of **over 200 migrant families** supplying home furnishings, school supplies and toiletries
- Provided the **Sterling/Glasser Quality Model training** throughout the District
- Provided **STEM@Work hands-on experiences to 325 students** by taking them out into the community
