MAJOR FUNCTION:

Perform supplemental duties and responsibilities that support a comprehensive middle school drama program.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Valid Florida teaching certificate.
- Current employee of the School District of Lee County.

Such alternatives to the above qualifications as the Board may find acceptable.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Interpersonal skills.
- Ability to relate to and inspire confidence in students.
- Knowledge of and experience with organizing student activities and events.
- Organizational, leadership, and managerial skills.
- Oral and written communication skills.
- Ability to lead diverse groups of people.
- Knowledge of and experience with industry-standard computer applications.

REPORTS TO: Designated Supervisor or Designated Administrator

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Prepare students for at least one full-length play or two one-act performances.
- Prepare students for the county-wide thespians competition.
- Secure performance rights for productions of published plays.
- Coordinate dates and times for drama activities with the principal or designee.
- Coordinate the selection of casts and other participants necessary for the production.
- Supervise students at all rehearsal sessions and during all drama activities.
- Obtain all props, sets, costumes, and equipment necessary for the performance of the activities.
- Coordinate all publicity, financial arrangements, and ticket sales.
- Assist administration with preparation and monitoring of the budget relating to drama activities, following established internal accounting procedures in collecting monies and in purchasing.



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- Provide coaching, mentoring, and support to students.
- Organize, supervise, and coordinate all meetings and activities which occur during the normal contractual day and extend beyond the normal contractual day.
- Assist in arrangement of transportation, chaperones, lodging, security, custodial help, and assistance at all appropriate activities in-county and out-of-county.
- Ride the bus to and from activities, staying until the last student leaves from that activity.
- Responsible for the care, cleaning, and securing of all school and District property.
- Report all accidents/injuries to the principal or designee.
- Adhere to District policies and procedures; abide by and enforce School Board policies on tobacco, alcohol, and drugs.
- Serve as a liaison between faculty, administration, students, and the community.
- Establish written guidelines for awards and special recognition.

OTHER JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Attend staff meetings and participate in conferences and other trainings to enhance job performance.
- Seek out professional development opportunities and maintain professional licensure and certifications.
- Promote the District’s interest in increasing student achievement by working with the educational interests of students in mind at all times.
- Maintain positive communication with colleagues, community members, parents, and students to promote an increase in community engagement in education.
- Support the retention of Highly Effective and Effective employees by exhibiting professionalism and making positive contributions to workplace morale.
- Promote a culture of high performance and continuous improvement by valuing learning and making a commitment to quality.

EXERTION TYPE:

- Medium work. Position requires exerting up to 50 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 30 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects.

This factor is important if the amount of balancing exceeds that needed for ordinary locomotion and maintenance of body equilibrium.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Climbing	Ascending or descending ladders, stairs, scaffolding, ramps, poles and the like, using feet and legs and/or hands and arms. Body agility is emphasized. This factor is important if the amount and kind of climbing required exceeds that required for ordinary locomotion.	10%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Crawling	Moving about on hands and knees or hands and feet.	10%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Crouching	Bending the body downward and forward by bending leg and spine.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Feeling	Perceiving attributes of objects, such as size, shape, temperature or texture by touching with skin, particularly that of fingertips.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Finger Dexterity	Picking, pinching, typing or otherwise working, primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand as in handling.	70%

<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Hearing	Perceiving the nature of sounds at normal speaking levels with or without correction. Ability to receive detailed information through oral communication, and to make the discriminations in sound.	100%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Kneeling	Bending legs at knee to come to a rest on knee or knees.	10%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Lifting	Raising objects from a lower to a higher position or moving objects horizontally from position-to-position. This factor is important if it occurs to a considerable degree and requires substantial use of upper extremities and back muscles.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Pulling	Using upper extremities to exert force in order to draw, haul, or tug objects in a sustained motion.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Pushing	Using upper extremities to press against something with steady force in order to thrust forward, downward, or outward.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Reaching	Extending hand(s) and arm(s) in any direction.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Repetitive Motion	Substantial movements (motions) of the wrists, hands, and/or fingers.	70%
