**MAJOR FUNCTION:**

Perform supplemental duties and responsibilities that support the requirements of a comprehensive high school JROTC program.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Valid Florida teaching certificate.
- JROTC Instructor Cadet Command certificate.
- Current employee of the School District of Lee County.
- Valid Adult and Child First Aid/CPR/AED certificate issued by the American Heart Association or American Red Cross.

**Such alternatives to the above qualifications as the Board may find acceptable.**

**KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:**

- Ability to relate to and inspire confidence in students.
- Knowledge of and experience with organizing student activities and events.
- Interpersonal, organizational, leadership, and managerial skills.
- Oral and written communication skills.
- Ability to work with and lead diverse groups of people.
- Knowledge of and experience with industry-standard computer applications.
- Ability to administer First Aid/CPR/AED as needed for illness, injury, or life-threatening emergencies per certification training guidelines.

**REPORTS TO:**

Designated Supervisor or Designated Administrator

**ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:**

- Assist the principal in developing short- and long-range goals for the continuous growth of a comprehensive JROTC program.
- Coach or assistant coach a JROTC extracurricular team and compete at a minimum of two (2) District-sanctioned JROTC meets.
- Supervise cadets at community and school initiatives and events outside the regular work hours.
- Encourage and prepare students to participate in Lee County JROTC activities and competitions as determined by the Director of Army Instruction.
- Prepare and supervise students through a service learning project in accordance with Cadet Command Regulation 145-2.
- Advise students in the preparation and monitoring of unit budgets.



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- Supervise the preparation of reports and records.
- Organize, coordinate, and supervise District-level JROTC competitions, events, and ceremonies.
- Administer First Aid/CPR/AED as needed for illness, injury, or life-threatening emergencies per certification training guidelines.

### OTHER JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Attend staff meetings and participate in conferences and other trainings to enhance job performance.
- Seek out professional development opportunities and maintain professional licensure and certifications.
- Promote the District's interest in increasing student achievement by working with the educational interests of students in mind at all times.
- Maintain positive communication with colleagues, community members, parents, and students to promote an increase in community engagement in education.
- Support the retention of Highly Effective and Effective employees by exhibiting professionalism and making positive contributions to workplace morale.
- Promote a culture of high performance and continuous improvement by valuing learning and making a commitment to quality.

### EXERTION TYPE:

- Medium work. Position requires exerting up to 50 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 30 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects.

Physical Requirement	Description	Percent of Time
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Balancing</b>	Maintaining body equilibrium to prevent falling and walking, standing or crouching on narrow, slippery, or erratically moving surfaces. This factor is important if the amount of balancing exceeds that needed for ordinary locomotion and maintenance of body equilibrium.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Climbing</b>	Ascending or descending ladders, stairs, scaffolding, ramps, poles and the like, using feet and legs and/or hands and arms. Body agility is emphasized. This factor is important if the amount and kind of climbing required exceeds that required for ordinary locomotion.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Crawling</b>	Moving about on hands and knees or hands and feet.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Crouching</b>	Bending the body downward and forward by bending leg and spine.	30%



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<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Feeling</b>	Perceiving attributes of objects, such as size, shape, temperature or texture by touching with skin, particularly that of fingertips.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Finger Dexterity</b>	Picking, pinching, typing or otherwise working, primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand as in handling.	80%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Grasping</b>	Applying pressure to an object with the fingers and palm.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Hearing</b>	Perceiving the nature of sounds at normal speaking levels with or without correction. Ability to receive detailed information through oral communication, and to make the discriminations in sound.	100%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Kneeling</b>	Bending legs at knee to come to a rest on knee or knees.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Lifting</b>	Raising objects from a lower to a higher position or moving objects horizontally from position-to-position. This factor is important if it occurs to a considerable degree and requires substantial use of upper extremities and back muscles.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Pulling</b>	Using upper extremities to exert force in order to draw, haul, or tug objects in a sustained motion.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Pushing</b>	Using upper extremities to press against something with steady force in order to thrust forward, downward, or outward.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Reaching</b>	Extending hand(s) and arm(s) in any direction.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Repetitive Motion</b>	Substantial movements (motions) of the wrists, hands, and/or fingers.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Seeing</b>	The ability to perceive the nature of objects by the eye.	100%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Sitting</b>	Particularly for sustained periods of time.	40%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Standing</b>	Particularly for sustained periods of time.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Stooping</b>	Bending body downward and forward by bending spine at the waist. This factor is important if it occurs to a considerable degree and requires full motion of the lower extremities and back muscles.	30%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Talking</b>	Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word. Those activities in which they must convey detailed or important spoken instructions to other workers accurately, loudly, or quickly.	70%
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <b>Walking</b>	Moving about on foot to accomplish tasks, particularly for long distances or moving from one work site to another.	20%
